5.2.7 Summary

All the results computed above were compiled into a summary table and findings were that there were more linguistic expressions used in a gender-fair way for both women and men in the Zambian media than those which were biased against men or

against women. This result is contrary to what was expected in as much as research generally suggests that the media is biased against women.

However, it is interesting to note that when the results are separated, a close analysis of the summary table reveals an exaggerated fairness in '-man' words (100%) and in personal titles (88.99%). This fairness is explained by the fact that whenever a '-man' word or a '-woman' word was used, it targeted a man or a woman as the case may be. Similarly, the title 'Mr' or 'Mrs/Miss' specifically targeted a man or a woman as the case may be and is not interchangeable, hence guaranteed gender-fairness. Table 41 presents full details of the summary.

In a nutshell, this section attempted to answer the second research question about the classification of the linguistic expressions as gender-fair or gender-biased. The study, whose results we have been discussing, does suggest that the expressions in question

can easily be classified GF or GB. Data available has also revealed that, in fact, four of these, specifically word order, generic nouns and pronouns, gender-related vocabulary and demeaning/patronising/pejorative expressions are normally used by the Zambian media to disadvantage women.

Having seen that classification of these expressions is possible, we proceed to the next section, where we attempt to relate the linguistic expressions under investigation to the gender of the referent.

5.3 Relationship of Both Gender-Fair and Gender-Biased Expressions to the Gender of the Referent

5.3.0 General

In the previous section, focus was on classification of the sampled expressions into two categories - gender-fair and gender-bias and the latter was further subdivided into BAM and BAW. From the study, we were able to conclude that some of the expressions used in the Zambian media were used fairly as far as gender was concerned but that others were biased.

With the research question answered, we attempt in this section to relate both the GF and the GN expressions to the gender of the referent using the same expressions and proceeding in the same way as we did in the previous section as follows:

- (i) Word Order
- (ii) Generic Nouns and Pronouns

- (iii) Gender-Related Vocabulary
- (iv) Demeaning/Patronising/Pejorative Expressions
- (v) '-man' Words
- (vi) Personal Titles

The statistical information provided in the each of the tables in this section is a summary of the data in the print media and that in the electronic media but for details, we refer the reader back to the tables in the previous section under the column 'Gender of Referent'

5.3.1 Word Order

Information provided in Table 42 indicates that there was no difference between male and female referents as regards word order. All of the 73 linguistic expressions investigated referred to both men and women, thereby doubling the number of referent to 146. This is because, logically, word order in this study was about two items, one male and the other female, following one another. Consequently, each component in each expression had equal participation, hence 50% for each as shown in the table below (see also Tables 23 and 24 in Section 5.2 for complete details).

5.3.2 Generic Nouns and Pronouns

All the generic nouns and pronouns that were studied referred to both females and males. Table 43 shows that in the electronic and print media, 50% of the terms used referred to the two sexes and these findings were true of the overall results for the media. In addition to the table below, Tables 26 and 27 in the previous section will give further information in the column 'Gender of Referent'.

5.3.3 Gender-Related Vocabulary

While 43.48% of referents of gender-linked vocabulary in the print media were females and 56.51% were males, the electronic media presented a balanced picture of 50% for each of the two genders. Despite this, as can be seen from Table 44, male referents still outnumbered their female participants when the two sectors of the media were combined with 14 participants (56%) against 11 (44%). Tables 29 and 30 are instrumental as they give further information on the gender of the referent.

5.3.4 Patronising/Demeaning/Pejorative Expressions

With regard to demeaning/patronising/pejorative expressions, a total of 70 linguistic expressions were selected for the analysis and out of these, \$7 (81.43%) were used against females and 13 (18.57%) against males. Analysis of Table 45 shows that most of these were transcribed from the electronic media, where oral language was used. The reader should note that Table 45 is a summary of Tables 32 and 33, which should be referred to for more complete information.

5.3.5 '-man' Words

It was noted that all, except 3 (3.90%) of the '-man' words found in the data referred to men rather than to women. This is partly because of media tendencies, in several cases, to use gender specific terms like 'chairman', 'spokesman' in relation to men and gender-neutral terms like 'chairperson' and 'spokesperson' to relate to women. The remaining 77 of the '-man' words (96.10%) were used to refer to men as seen in the table below. Follow-up data is available in Tables 35 and 36 in Section 5.2

5.3.6 Personal Titles

The distribution of men and women referred to in the sample of personal titles generally reflect the patterns of under-representation of women that many researchers have found in their analysis. Of the 563 titles selected, only 119 (21.14%) were female titles referring to women and the other 444 (78.86%) male titles referring to men. There was significant association between the ratio of the overall picture and that of the print and electronic media separated. For instance, Table 47 shows that in the print media, only 20.82% of the titles had women as

referents in comparison with only 23.08% in the electronic media. As in the preceding sections, a follow-up can be made with Tables 38 and 39.

5.3.7 Summary

Finally, when all the data from the six categories were combined and computed to determine gender referential statistics for both print and electronic media as indicated in the summary Table 48, it was found that out of 976 linguistic items, only 309 (31.66%) referred to women and 667 (68.34%) referred to men.

While word order and generic nouns and pronouns presented balanced figures for men and women, gender-linked vocabulary, '-man' words and personal titles referred less to women than they did to men. Demeaning expressions, on the other hand, had a higher frequency of 57 (81.43%) for women.

In concluding this section, and in answering the third research question, we have seen that many of the linguistic expressions available can be related to the gender of the referent but some cannot. This explains why some of the frequencies in this section did not add up to the frequencies in the previous section. Nouns like 'tongue' in 'mother tongue' (P395, E1944) to refer to someone's first language and 'body' in 'mother body' (P17, P887, E1554) to refer to a trade union are gender-neutral. Therefore, these vocabulary items referred to nouns without gender and were eliminated from the computation.

Having related the linguistic expressions to the gender of their referents, we shall, in the next section, attempt to relate these expressions to the gender of the originator. In many instances, the originator, as we saw earlier, is the writer of the story, the speaker or the singer as the case may be.

5.4 Relationship of Both Gender-Fair and Gender-Biased Expressions to the Message Source or Originator

5.4.0 General

In the last section, our task was to relate gender-fair and gender-biased expressions to the referent of the gender and our findings were that most of these expressions favoured men more than they did women, with the exception of word order and the generic use of nouns and pronouns which referred to men as much as they did to women.

In the current section, our preoccupation was to relate both the GF and the GB to the originator of the message or the writer of the story as the case may be. As in the earlier section, the frequencies in some of the categories may not up to the number of sampled expressions because in some cases, the gender of the originator of the story or message was not known. This was the case with press articles written by 'Political Analyst' or 'Times Correspondent' or simply 'Reuters' without a journalist's or writer's name attached to the article. In such cases, the gender of the originator was ignored and left out of the computation and only those that were available added up to 100%.

As in the preceding sections, we proceed with our study of the relating the genderfair and the gender-bias expressions to the gender of the originator in the following order:

- (i) Word Order
- (ii) Generic Nouns and Pronouns
- (iii) Gender-Related Vocabulary
- (iv) Demeaning/Patronising/Pejorative Expressions
- (v) '-man' Words
- (vi) Personal Titles

The statistical information provided in the each of the tables in this section is a summary of the data in the print media and that in the electronic media but for details, we refer the reader back to the tables under the column 'Gender of Originator' as we did in Section 5.3

5.4.1 Word Order

A total of 62 male and female originators were identified from both the print and the electronic media. Of these sources, 19 (30.65%) were women and 43 (69.35%) were men. This is another obvious case of under-representation of women in the Zambian combined media. The pattern was the same in the individual sectors of the media as shown in Table 49, where female story originators in the electronic media were at 16% as opposed to their male counterparts who had 84%. However, findings show that the frequency in the print media was higher for women at 40.54% but still ranked behind men, who had 59.46%.

5.4.2 Generic Nouns and Pronouns

With respect to generic nouns and pronouns, results indicated a definite discrepancy between the number of female sources and that of male sources in the two media sectors. Consequently, the number of females who featured as writers or sources of these linguistic expressions which were generically oriented was 3 out of 31. This represented 9.68% while their male counterparts enjoyed 90.32% as shown in the table below.

5.4.3 Gender-Related Vocabulary

The picture shown in the table above was similar to the one on gender-related vocabulary, though this time with higher values for female sources. Women recorded a total of 6 (23.08%) out of the 26 sources but men still led the table with 20 (76.92%). These results are displayed in Table 51 below.

5.4.4 Patronising/Demeaning/Pejorative Expressions

Of the 75 sources of in this category, only 14 (18.67%) were female and 61 (81.33%) were males. This shows that the overall figures simply upheld the statistical results obtaining in the print and electronic media considered separately, where women in the print media originated 25% of the gender-related vocabulary, against 75% for men and 17.91% against 82.09% in the electronic media.

5.4.5 '-man' Words

The overall distribution of men and women sources in the samples of '-man' words favoured male originators whose linguistic expressions accounted for 90.24% of the 41 that were available. This was notwithstanding the fact that the electronic media considered separately had a well-balanced distribution for male and female sources as seen in this table.

5.4.6 Personal Titles

Through the use of personal titles, men continued to have a better representation than women as originators of linguistic expressions used in the media. In this regard, only 88 (29.63%) out of the 297 titles were extracted from news, stories or utterances that were originated by women while 209 (70.37%) were from male sources. Details of

Table 54 reveal that this pattern does not differ much from that obtaining in the other linguistic expressions under investigation.

5.4.7 Summary

The present section has attempted to relate both the GF and the GB linguistic items to the gender of the originator of the message and one observation is very clear - that the Zambian media has more males than females contributing information in terms of potentially gender-biased linguistic expressions such as word order, generic nouns and pronouns, gender-related vocabulary, demeaning expressions, '-man' words and personal titles. In each of the six categories listed, men were seen to be more frequent contributors than women. Apart from word order and personal titles male originators greatly outnumber their counterparts to a ratio of 3:1, the rest of the linguistic themes saw frequencies of women's participation sinking as low as 9.76% for '-man' words, 13.33% for generic nouns and pronouns for demeaning/patronising/pejorative expressions, with men recording correspondingly 90.24%, 86.67% and 76.92%. This pattern, as can be seen from the summary table,

dictates the overall statistics in which, it is noted, women contributed only in 25.42% of the cases as opposed to men whose contribution is 74.58% of the 531 cases.

5.5 Conclusion

Chapter Five has made us aware of unequal representation of males and females in the Zambian media. It has enabled us to find answers to four research questions which were framed in accordance with the objectives of the study in Chapter One. The Chapter has unveiled crucial disparities between women and men in regards to their participation in the media despite the endorsement of the National Policy that came into being in the year 2000.

In summary, the study showed that sources of linguistic expressions under investigation in the Zambian media are predominantly male. This indicator suggests that access to the Zambian media by women as sources of linguistic expressions is

visibly narrow. We can therefore deduce that gender representation in the media favours men because their access is to a large extent unrestricted.

Having pursued all the objectives and research questions directing this study, we are now going to consider the implications of these results. Chapter Six therefore discusses the findings that have been reported in the current chapter and will also highlight the major findings, with a possible explanation for the disparities between the participation of men and that of women in the Zambian media. It is also the role of the chapter to draw some conclusions and make vital recommendations regarding the use of language in the media.

CHAPTER SIX

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

6.0 General

In the previous chapter, the data that was collected was used to determine the extent to which linguistic expressions extracted from both the print and the electronic media were gender-fair or gender-biased. Furthermore, the chapter sought to relate the expressions in question to the gender of the referent and to the gender of the writer of the story or the originator of the message. All the results were reported and it was found that on the whole, the media tends to favour men more than it does women in terms of the six linguistic categories being investigated.

The current chapter is intended to discuss the findings of the study and relate them to results of other studies that have been carried out in the field of language and gender. Following the findings, we hope to propose solutions to some of the questions raised in the first chapter and to explain the relationship that exists between language and gender.

The chapter is divided into three sections. The first section discusses findings of the present study and this will lead to salient conclusions in the second section. After these conclusions have been drawn, we shall give some recommendations about the use of gendered-language in the media. This will constitute the third section.

6.1 Summary of Findings

On the whole, results gathered in all the analyses done so far correspond with previous research in the area of language and gender. They revealed a significant relationship between the two variables with a bias towards masculinity. In the first part of the study, an attempt was made to identify common linguistic expressions used by the media to refer to men and women and this yielded a total of 3135 items. In all categories of the quantitative analysis, men and ideas about them or male terms appeared to be more visible than women to a linguistic figure of 83.19%. This communicates a very strong message and, given this trend, it is logical to assume that men enjoy a comfortable 83.19% favour from the media and that the world of media in Zambia comprises only 16.81% women. This is not withstanding the fact that about 51% of the Zambian population are women.

Overall assessment of the treatment of word order in the media revealed that men preceded women. In other words, word order favoured men because, in most of the cases, the male sex preceded the female sex. Not only do the results conform to the demands by early grammarians like Kirby and Wilson that the male sex should go before the female one, but they are also in harmony with findings by Ansary and Babaii (2002), whose study of two Iranian textbooks of English revealed that male firstness was prevalent. On the contrary, in our age, we must not be content with 16th century proclamations by Wilson and others because it is evident that scholars at the time were writing for an educated male audience, but Zambian journalists are writing for and speaking to a modern society where the audience is composed of women and men, who are educated and stand as partners on an equal footing.

The situation worsened with generic nouns and pronouns because most generic terms known in the English language are male terms. There were a negligible number of female terms used generically, and other than this, the results showed that most generic terms are male terms used to include women. In gender-related vocabulary and other themes, women continued to trail behind men when the two sectors of the media were considered as a whole. The findings seemed to be a natural application of various voices that spoke about language and gender way back in history and also a confirmation of studies conducted before the current one, one of them having been undertaken by Kerry (1998) who found that fewer females were portrayed in children's television cartoons and even those who were, were stereotypically portrayed. Another message that the media sent to clients is the content of the 'Better TV' (E1876) advertisement beamed by the nation's largest media house, in which the TV inspector's language implied that a woman did not have the right to head a household and asked for the name of the husband and further supposed that the inspector that was going to come would be a man. Together with other situations encountered in the extracts, this is how the media presented women as being silent and dependent in relation to men.

With men taking the lead over women in nearly all aspects of popular media communication, one would not be wrong to assert that women are neglected to a large extent in the media, just like in other spheres of society. No doubt that this is a problem for them, justifying the proliferation of institutions such as Lusaka Ladies Circle, FAWEZA and YWCA designed to enable them alleviate their problems. The establishment of gender-based institutions is an encouragement to women or men as

the case may be. Conversely, we feel that the aims and objectives of these institutions should be checked because, if not properly handled, these can bring about more gender divisions between men and women, in turn defeating the cause for the fight against gender imbalance. This is an era where men and women must work in collaboration and win the fight against gender inequality and bring about the long awaited change in society. Since most of the gender differences are culturally based, especially that society is mainly patriarchal, we do not know how long women put up with the slow pace at which change is taking place nor whether they must they just stay muted when they are underrepresented or mal-represented in the media in the name of waiting for change.

Compared with the gender survey conducted MISA in Southern African countries, of which Zambia was part in the year 2000, the findings are similar in that male participation continues to surpass that of females. However, it was predicted that the figures would vary because, in the first place, given that the present research was more comprehensive and was linguistically oriented while the earlier study was basically concerned with news sources. Secondly, the present study has been conducted several years later, with the National Gender Policy in place. This policy has offered direction to media authorities and editors and the long period between the two studies has provided room for professional maturity and more gender awareness among media houses.

Regardless of the figures, one thing is clear. From a linguistic viewpoint, the media in Zambia is still far more a world for men than for women. In the light of these

findings, one is tempted to question the role and success since the implementation of the National Gender Policy vis-à-vis the media.

6.2 Conclusions

This study aimed to undertake an enquiry into the relationship between language and gender using the Zambian media as platform. It began with a review of factors at play in gender development and in the relationship between language and gender as documented by researchers and linguists to date. We further took an account of various gender biases in language that can promote segregation between men and women. As we went further into the study, we did an analysis of articles from sampled Zambian newspapers and programmes from radio and television.

The linguistic themes that were analysed in the present study were extracted from both the print and the electronic media. The data was analysed qualitatively and quantitatively and the evidence that was accumulated during the study was too significant to be ignored – there is a lot of sexism in the media. Although several attempts have been made by various organisations and the government itself to reduce the gap between men and women, and despite the literature on language and gender for journalists and editors to read, we still see a media that, in terms of language, continues to glorify men and to present biases against women.

In terms of quantitative linguistic analysis of themes like word order, the use of generic pronouns and personal titles, the study revealed significant disparities between language used for women and that used for men, to the advantage of men. In

the qualitative phase, we carried out a linguistic analysis of gendered language and suggested alternatives to help circumvent sexism whenever and wherever it appeared.

The study has, however, shown that some of these biases were not ingrained in the media itself but emanate from society and that the media was only an inadvertent tool tasked to convey them, either knowingly or unknowingly. This was largely the case with songs, advertisements or articles authored outside the media and passed on to the media for onward diffusion to the public. There were cases, as we saw, where the media had no part to play in the production of linguistic items that had gender imbalances. Whatever the case, knowingly or not, the media cannot be excused for the reason that it is the role of the learned journalists, editors and decision-makers to remind their stake-holders — correspondents, musicians, advertisers, interviewees — of these biases and to edit them where need be.

Looking at past local and foreign research on language and gender or gender and the media, we find that the findings of this confirm what other researchers have found. In fact, comparing the current study with the 2003 baseline study, we realise that the media in Zambia is making good progress as regards gender, though we would be interested to know what results the previous study would have recorded had it concentrated on the linguistic aspect.

The current study was worthwhile because it revealed serious issues that need to be tackled without delay. Since culture is dynamic, it follows that women cannot be regarded as inferior to men any more. This change should be reflected in language.

We live in a modern world where men and women are equal partners, endowed with the same roles, which does not warrant the numerous linguistic differences that this study has revealed.

Whether the media shapes the minds of the people, or whether culture influences language, the country needs concerted efforts from all stakeholders in order to aid the media effect change in its manner of reporting. We are well aware that this change cannot take place overnight, but we hope that as people are getting more and more enlightened on issues of gender, in the near future we may have in place a media whose practices will be responsive to the needs of women and sensitive to language and gender.

6.3 Recommendations

Based on the findings and conclusion of this study, we wish to make recommendations at various levels to enhance fair gender representation in the media, granted that the media has a responsibility to impart gender-fairness to its consumers. The study makes recommendations to the media, to the society and to the civil society. In addition to this, the study makes recommendations to all interested parties for future research.

6.3.1 Recommendations for the Media

Following findings of past and present research on language and gender, the media, through its decision makers, should address problems of stereotyped representations and biased use of language for men and women. To this effect:

- (i) journalists and editors need to enhance their awareness of sexism in language, by attending socio-linguistic training and gender-sensitisation courses. This will enable them develop the skill and linguistic know-how required to curb the use of sexist language. A training programme in which language components are part of the package should to equip trainees with linguistic tools that will render them more aware of gender issues. This can be in the form of in-house training or long-term language courses in reputable institutions like the University of Zambia. Other than media training, institutions should offer effective on-the-job training by way of seminars and on-line training not only for journalists but for management whose role it is to guide and direct journalists in gender issues;
- the media should, after training its personnel, embark on deliberate linguistic awareness campaigns to educate the masses about the use of gender-fair language. Furthermore, media houses should from time to time conduct research about how people perceive the language that is disseminated to them through the media;
- (iii) sexist language should be checked and censured or edited out by relevant authorities within the media house. All gender insensitive material like songs, proverbs and pieces of theatre forwarded to the media for diffusion to the public should pass through hands of highly trained and linguistically competent editors who should play an advisory role with respect to such material. Where these cannot be censured, they should be turned down. In the

event that they are passed, follow-up programmes or articles should immediately be arranged to criticize or disassociate from them;

- (iv) media decision-makers should make an inventory of their daily papers and transmissions to enable them check the nature of language and the amount of participation of men and women and later take appropriate action; and
- (v) the media should put in place a language policy on gender that should be flexible and allow itself to be monitored by independent language experts who should judge and advise when language is not being used fairly.

6.3.2 Recommendations for the Society

Zambians should be aware of the fact that gender biases are deeply ingrained in society as suggested by Johnson (2002) but even more importantly, we should identify these biases and correct them as soon as they are noticed. This calls for:

- (i) awareness among ourselves regarding the use of language; and
- each other as equal partners. It is this new attitude that will perform a natural clean up of language, without necessarily having to change language. The benefit of this to society is that it will help achieve the use of language that is devoid of sexism. This achievement will in turn be passed on to the media, which will in turn pass it on to the society.

6.3.3 Recommendations for Policy Makers

Policy makers, in particular Government, have a central role to play in the whole scenario of language and gender in the media. Policy makers should:

- (i) ensure that media houses adhere to the NGP which stipulates that women and men should be treated equally in every sphere of life;
- (ii) play an advisory role or take appropriate action where the NGP is not being adhered to;
- (iii) see to it that the implementation of a language policy on gender proposed in 6.3.1 (v) is carried to address all aspects of language use in the media, vis-à-vis gender.

6.3.4 Recommendations to the Civil Society

In the event that efforts by policy makers are futile and in the absence of a regulatory body, the civil society, along with gender activists should monitor the performance of media practitioners especially with regard to the use of language vis-à-vis gender because the media can be an effective tool in the elimination of inequalities that exist between men and women. Any media house that does not comply should be dealt with accordingly.

6.3.5 Recommendations for Future Research

After all recommendations to media authorities, society and policy makers, change is expected in the way language is used in the media vis-à-vis gender. We therefore recommend;

- (i) a follow-up study after a few years partly to ascertain the extent to which the media will have adhered to the recommendations made in this study but mainly to investigate whether or not there would be any reduction or elimination of sexism in the language used in the media. This follow-up cannot be immediate for the reason that the media needs a bit of time to digest the findings of this study and to work on corrective measures;
- (ii) a study into people's perceptions about the way language is used vis-à-vis gender to disseminate information to the public through the media;
- (iii) a study into journalists' and management's level of awareness about gender issues from a language viewpoint; and
- (iv) An enquiry into other sectors than the media, such as government, the church and private organizations where documents like letters, speeches, sermons and policy documents can be analysed for language use.

If these recommendations are adhered to, there is little or no doubt that we shall produce a society where members will learn to be gender-sensitive in the use

language as a tool of communication. It is hoped that the findings of this study will serve as a wake up call for the media and Zambian society and that the authorities concerned will treat the recommendations made here as a matter of urgency; otherwise, this study about language and gender in the media, which has taken so much time and resources, is a mere academic exercise.
